Information

The German Table Hockey Association (DTEV) applied to host the ITHF European Championships 2026 (ECh 2026). The application is submitted on behalf of German club Black Forest Werewolves – led by Hermann Petuch –, who are prepared to organize the ECh 2026 in Lahr/Schwarzwald.

The DTEV has set a clear goal to further develop Table Hockey in Germany. Hosting such a prestigious event as the ECh 2026 would provide strong support in engaging local players and taking the sport in Germany to the next level. DTEV is therefore pleased to endorse the application presented by a proven organizing team under the leadership of Hermann – together with the Black Forest Werewolves (a five-time German team champion in Table Hockey).

The last time Germany was awarded an international championship in Table Hockey was in 1999 – in the previous century – at a time when most of today's players were not yet involved in the sport, and some were not even born.
